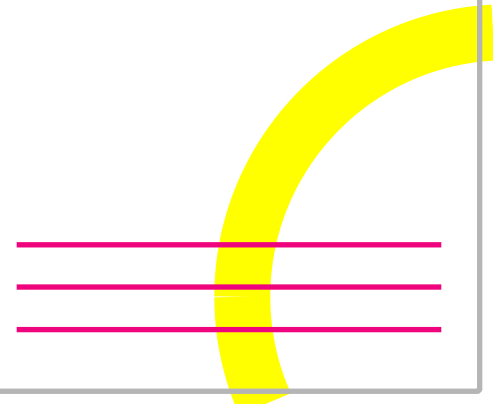
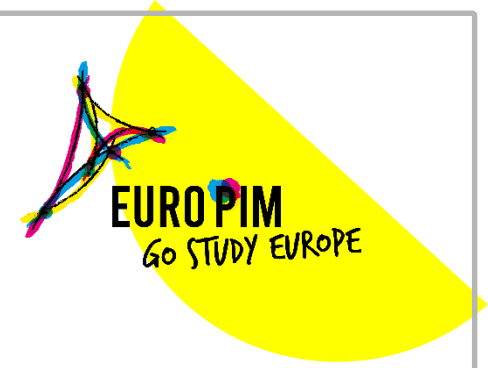

FUNDING

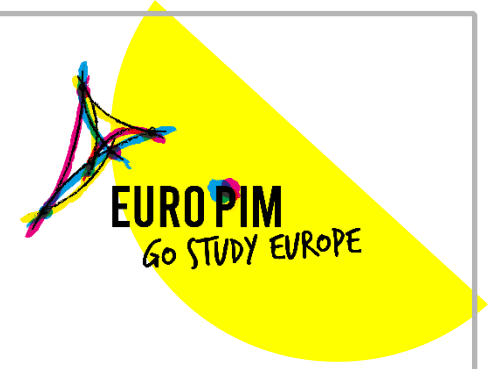
In case you are receiving funding from us, please make sure you provided your personal information including your bank account via our reimbursement form (check your confirmation e-mail).

In the case you are not receiving a fix lump sum/ scholarship, please make sure to hand in your original tickets/ invoices.

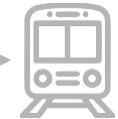
Please make sure to sign the participation lists including the DAAD lists which will be handed out during the block week.

HOW TO ARRIVE TO DORTMUND



BY CITY TRAIN

If you arrive by train you should travel to Dortmund Central Station (Dortmund Hauptbahnhof).



BY INTERNATIONAL BUS

Buses arrive at the central bus station called 'ZOB' ['tsob:], which is located right at the North Entrance of Dortmund Central Station (Hauptbahnhof). Go through the tunnel that leads across the central train station and then follow the directions 'By walking'.



BY PLANE (FROM DORTMUND AIRPORT)

Option 1: From the airport: Take the airport express (**9,00€**). It will take 25 minutes to get to the Central Station (Hauptbahnhof). Then follow the route from the Central Station described above.

Option 2: Take the bus 490 (**2,90€ for a 90 minutes trip**) from the second bus stop to the right from the airport exit, when you leave the airport. Change at 'Aplerbeck' onto the metro line U47, direction 'Westerfilde'; get off at 'Kampstrasse' or continue to the Central Station (Hauptbahnhof). Then follow the instructions above for 'By walking'. It takes about 50 minutes in total.



BY PLANE (FROM DÜSSELDORF AIRPORT)

Take the SkyTrain from your terminal to the airport's railway station "Düsseldorf Flughafen". Buy a ticket at the red machines with the logo "DB", they provide English language as well. Navigate through the options on the screen and indicate that you go to Dortmund Hauptbahnhof, choose the train type "RE" or "Regional". The ticket costs 15,40€ for a single ride. While buying the ticket, the machine will indicate to you at what time the next train leaves to Dortmund.

The regional trains to Dortmund normally leave from platform 5 or platform 1, but please check for changes. Make sure it indicates Dortmund on the platform screen before you get on the train. The trip will take from 40 - 50 minutes. Please make sure you validate your ticket (at the small orange machines next to your vending machine) before you get on the train to Dortmund. If you don't, you run the risk of receiving a 60€ fine.

!!! For travelling by ICE train you will need a special ticket for this rapid service train which costs 25,50€.

PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION

- * Within the City of Dortmund, you can travel by bus, metro and local trains (S-Bahn).
- * **!!!** Please remember that while traveling by bus in Dortmund, in order to get off, you have to push the red button **BEFORE** your stop. Otherwise, the bus may not stop. This also applies to the surface stations when you travel by metro. Normally, every stop is announced.



PRICES FOR TICKETS

- * Single ticket (valid for 90 minutes in one direction): 2,90€, 4-rides-ticket: 10,50€ (must be stamped every 90 minutes ride, otherwise you can get a fine!)
- * Day pass for 1/2/3/4/5 persons: 7,10€/10,50€/13,90€/17,30€/20,70€.

TICKETS FOR PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION

- * For public transportation within Dortmund, you have to buy a ticket in the category A (A3) for 2,90€ at the vending machines on stations or from the bus driver in buses; and stamp it before getting on the train or metro or stamp it on the bus with the machine next to the bus driver.
- * **!!!** Please remember to validate your ticket when traveling with public transportation.

The A&O hostel is located on the right side.

from Dortmund Central Station from track 7.
Exit at Dortmund Universität.

from Dortmund Central Station from track 7.
Exit at Dortmund Universität.

from Dortmund Central Station from track 7.
Exit at Dortmund Universität.

from Dortmund Central Station from track 7.
Exit at Dortmund Universität.

Route from Dortmund Central Station

Take the local train from Dortmund Central Station (direction Bochum) and get off at Bochum Central Station (Hauptbahnhof). Take the metro line U35 (direction Riemke Markt) and exit at Deutsches Bergbau-Museum. Walk southwards and turn left onto Nordring. Cross Nordring onto the other side and walk for about 150m. The hotel is on the right side.

Route to FH Dortmund – Campus Emil-Figge-Strasse (Dortmund Universität)

Take the local train S1 to Dortmund Central Station (Hauptbahnhof). Exit at: Dortmund Universität.

Leave the Central Station through the main exit and continue straight south through Katharinenstraße. Once you reach Kampfstraße turn left and then right on the next street named Kolpingstraße. Continue to walk straight until you reach the roundabout take the first street to your left and the hotel will be at your right.

Take the local train S1 to Essen/ Solingen from Dortmund Central Station from track 7. Exit at Dortmund Universität.

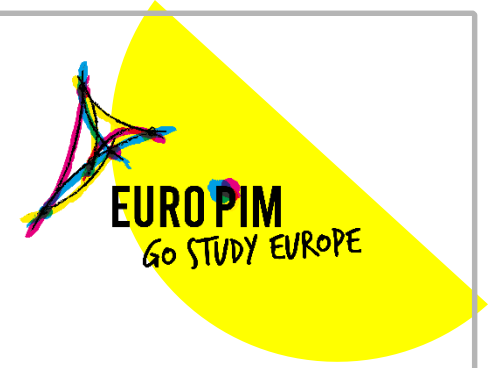

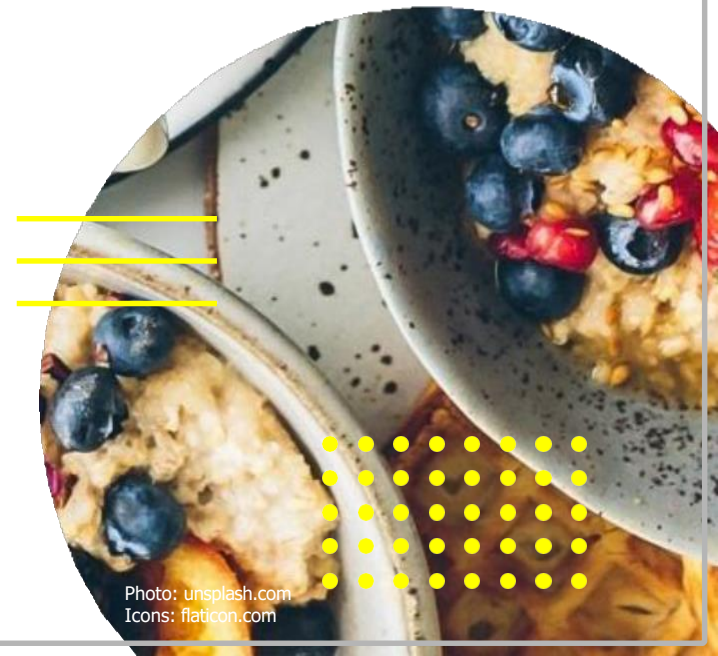

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Dortmunder U

- The Dortmunder U, also known as the U Tower, was a high-rise building erected in 1926 "fermentation and storage cellar" of the Dortmunder Union Brewery on the western edge of Dortmund City.
- The name is derived from the brewery's logo: a four-sided, nine- metre high, gilded and illuminated "U" designed by the architect Ernst Neufert.
- The City of Dortmund acquired the site in 2007 and had the "Dortmunder U", which had been empty until then, converted into a centre for art and creativity for the European Capital of Culture - RUHR.2010. It houses, among others, the Museum Ostwall and the Hartware Medienkunstverein.
- You can go in there free of charge and without registration



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Phoenix - See

- The Phoenix-See is an artificial lake of about 24 hectares on the former steelworks site Phoenix-Ost in the Dortmund district of Hörde.
- It was and is considered a showcase project for the structural transformation of the city of Dortmund and the Ruhr region.
- There are many beautiful restaurants and coffee shops. The Phoenix-See is also a good place for walking and hiking.



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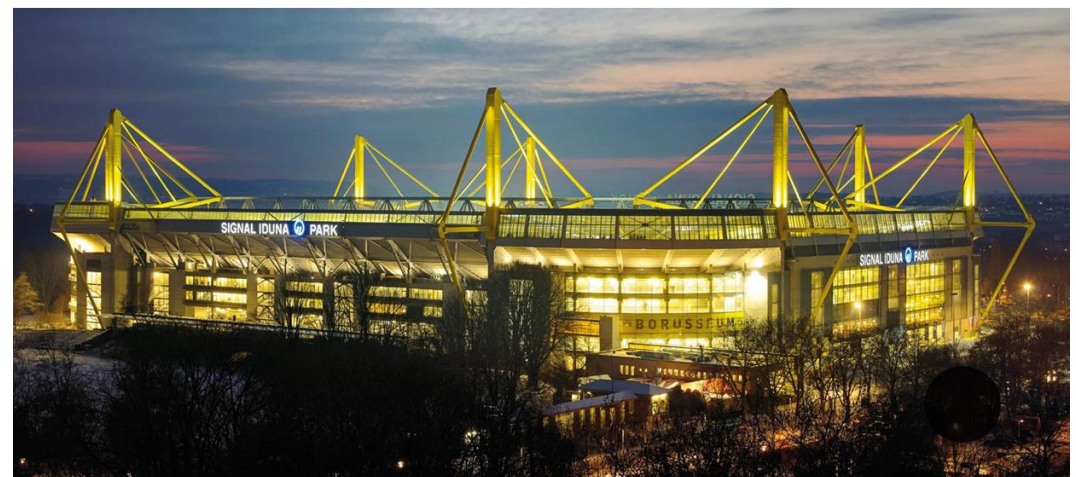
WHAT TO DO IN DORTMUND DURING FREE TIME*

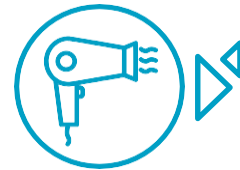


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HINTS, HINTS, HINTS

Do not hesitate to ask local students from FH Dortmund who will be participating in the events for help!

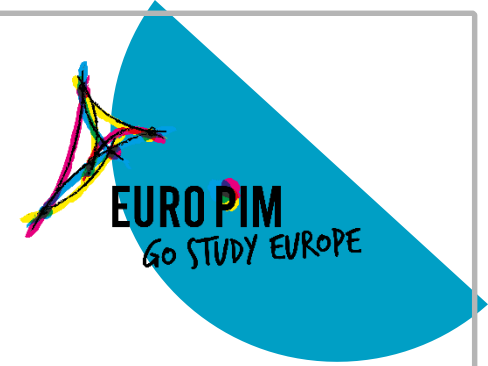

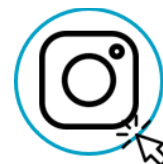
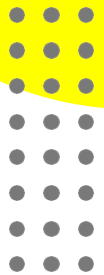
